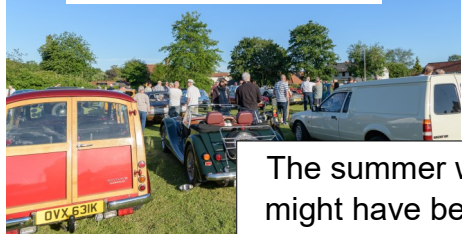

Tostock Cribbage Team

My name is Jim Debenham, and I am the Team Captain for the Tostock Cribbage Team. The Team Vice Captain is Andy Creamer.

The Crib team was formed in about 1980 and have won the league seven times since then. We played at The Gardeners Arms for many years until 2022 when for two years we played at the White Horse Beyton but we have now returned to Tostock as winners of the 2023 to 2024 season. The Cup is proudly displayed behind the bar at The Gardeners Arms.

The club plays crib on a Monday night (normally starting at 8.30pm) in the IDP Village Cribbage League and from September our Home venue is The Gardeners Arms. The league starts in September and finishes in the March of the following year. Our away games cover The Red House Stanningfield, Bardwell Duncow, Ixworth Greyhound, Horringer Club, Beyton White Horse and Felsham Six Bells (there are two teams).

The cost is £1 a head when selected to play. We also hold regular practice nights fortnightly on a Wednesday evening starting at 7.30pm at The Gardeners Arms throughout the year. Currently we have 10 members in the Team. The league games require 6 people from each team to play in a match, so players are selected to give an even spread of games and of course based on availability.

Barn Owls

I was kindly invited to Rosemary's House, to see some baby barn owls in her field! I was so excited and pleased to be asked!

When we got there, there was a crowd of people to see them, a man from the Suffolk Barn Owl Project had to get a ladder and carefully get the baby owls out of their owl box and put them into a special bag, then he was able to carefully handle them to measure their wing span, I was lucky enough to hold one.

Did you know?

You can tell if its male or female if it has spots on the underside of their wings. These owls both had spots meaning there were males and approximately 48 - 52 days old and super white and fluffy. We were able to tell their age by measuring the length of the 7th feather in, which is called the primary feather. They normally fledge the nest around 67 days old. So should be now well on their way to starting their life.

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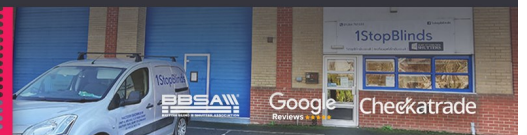
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TOSTOCK AUTUMN CRAFT FAYRE SUN 29th Sept Village Hall 10am - 4pm Pet Friendly

Young trees use up a lot of energy trying to establish their roots in the soil, so need our help in the first couple of years.

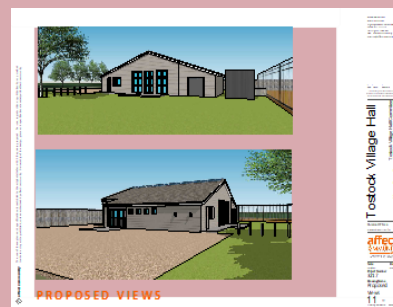

Village Hall Improvement Project

The Building Regulation application process remains on-going. As previously outlined, the building regulations will detail the technical standards set down by the Government to make sure all improvement work is carried out to reasonable standards, covering areas such as fire safety, energy consumption and accessibility.

Alongside this, a key focus remains on researching and applying for both national, as well as local grants, to help fund the list of improvement work on our wish-list. The Committee is also focussing its efforts on our community fundraising, with the Village Hall Lottery – 100 Club hopefully soon being finalised, as well as other fundraising events.

Parish Council report – 16th July 2024

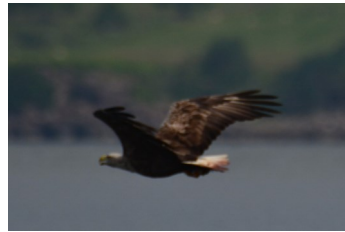


The Parish Council meeting had been postponed from 9th July.

There were reports of trees and hedges being cut down in the village and it was agreed to ask the Mid Suffolk Tree Officer to come and look round the village. It may be necessary to make Tree Preservation Orders. Tostock has a Biodiversity policy that seeks to preserve the environment and beauty of our village.

The issue of dog poo was brought to the attention of the council. There seems to have been an increase in recent months and this is unacceptable. There are 8 dog bins in and around the village and they should be used. PLEASE USE THEM.

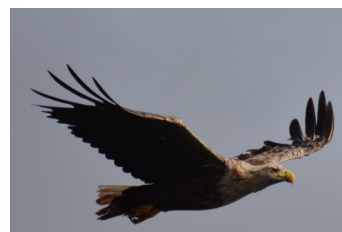
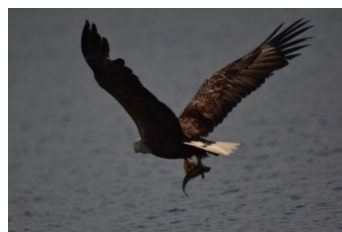
White-tailed Eagle soars over Tostock, yes it takes some believing but it's true. Some of you that are members of the Suffolk Wildlife Trust would have seen and read about it in your latest magazine, about a pair of White-tailed Eagles seen flying around Mid-Suffolk early part of this year. Apparently one landed down on the ground in Woolpit. They were also seen in Stowlangtoft. A fellow colleague of mine photographed one taking a pike out of the lake at Micklemere, Pakenham. But the good news is my neighbour spotted one flying over his house in Wood Close and then onto the Blackbourn Valley. It is believed that the pair are juveniles and one of them seen originated from the Netherlands, the other possibly from down south or the Isle of Wight. Juveniles



tend to be vagrant and will explore and seek out potential territories in order to breed and travel vast distances in search of food. I myself due to unforeseen

circumstances didn't manage to see them, nevertheless I wasn't unduly worried because Penny and I spent a week's holiday 2021 up in Mull, Scotland, where I managed to photograph them there – now let's take a look at some of my photographs.

Around 1,500 years ago there were as many as 1,400 pairs of White-tailed Eagles occupying many lowland areas of Britain and Northern Ireland. It was highly revered and featured in some of the best-known epic poetry of early medieval England. But the 16th century marked the start of 400 years of persecution until the last one in Britain was shot and killed in Shetland in 1918. The story of the White-tailed Eagles has become a kind of modern day totem and a much needed symbol of what's possible in nature conservation. The RSPB's combination of methods they use depends on the species, the threats it faces, its habitats and locations. After a couple of false starts, a re-introduction programme began in 1975, involving trans locations from Norway into three Scottish areas. The first successful breeding was recorded on the Isle of Mull in 1985 – the first in the U.K. for more than 70 years – the pictures above could well be descendants. Any moving of birds must be undertaken legally and with the support of people at the areas where the birds are coming from and the release site. During the re-introduction process the RSPB worked with the local Police and communities to raise awareness and help reduce the impact of egg theft, they also liaised with farmers and crofters to address their concerns around Eagles allegedly taking lambs. A recent study found that lambs are not a major part of the diet of breeding White-tailed Eagles. They are now around 150 pairs in Scotland and happily the first pair in England bred successfully in 2023. 2.5m wingspan makes the White-tailed Eagle the U.K.'s largest bird of prey (just imagine that is larger than your double sized bed). The re-established population on the west coast of Scotland is increasing and species has been downgraded to the U.K. amber list of conservation concern. The population in Scotland has even become the source population for a re-introduction project by Roy Dennis Wildlife Foundation and Forestry England on the Isle of Wight,



with the RSPB helping to identify suitable donor nests.

For now, the White-tailed Eagle is a bird well on its way to being restored to its rightful place in our cultural society. I am sticking my neck out and predicting that one day it will be back here breeding in Suffolk. What a thought.
