

Parish Council News

Meeting 12th August.

All Parish Councillors were present at the meeting as were three members of the public and the Clerk. MSDC Councillors attended to answer questions on his report. All reports from both MSDC and SCC councillors are put on the village website in the Parish Council section. A detailed report by the Tree Officers was warmly welcomed by the Council. Trees which might need preservation orders were identified as well as some requiring remedial attention and others which were deemed to be rare or of special interest. Part of the village (Church Road area) is still to be examined so the overall position will be considered at the November meeting. The aim will then be to determine action, including the creation of a possible working party and a potential budget.

A resident had written to the Clerk about the problem of HGV traffic using Tostock as a short cut when there were roadworks or other hold-ups on the A14.

It was with sadness that the Council had learned that Kim Mars was to step down as Editor of the Chronicle at the end of November 2025. The December/January edition will be his last. Kim has brought colour, variety and interest to the Chronicle and the Parish Council thanked him for all his hard work and enthusiasm. The vacant post will be advertised on the Village notice boards and Facebook but Kat Bauly and Jane Storey will take over from Kim when he steps down, if a new editor hasn't be found by then. Kat works at Ticehurst Gravels and Jane is Parish Chairman. If anyone else is interested, please contact Jane or the Parish Clerk.

Another vacant post – which has already been advertised – is that of Webmaster for the Tostock Village website. The Parish Clerk maintains the section relating to all Parish Council matters but it needs a person who can liaise with all the clubs and groups that we have in the village and make sure that the calendar, events and news sections are kept up to date. This will also be advertised again.

There were no outstanding planning matters.



All creatures grand and small. They say that small is beautiful, it is in my eyes anyway, so for this edition I am bringing you some of my smallest insects and creatures. Some are so small blink and you can miss them or you literately need to get down on your hands and knees to see things. You have to take my word for it, because that is exactly what I had to do to get this first





photo of a Grayling butterfly. It was so well camouflaged, I was just inches away and I couldn't still see the butterfly until my friend pointed it out with a blade of grass almost touching it, then I got the shot.

Here is a much clearer shot I managed to get afterwards. The life cycle of the ultimate British Moth the (Emperor Moth). I've been fortunate enough to photograph all 4 stages because of a good friend of mine who invited me. We start with the lava caterpillar which then goes into a pupa around about June, then turns into the moth. The female then allows the male to mate then afterwards she will go along and lay her eggs.











Here are the 4 stages after about 20 days the eggs will turn into caterpillars and the cycle will start all over again for another year. This 5th picture is of the striking male. These days you can get insects and creatures that can look pretty awful, such as this next photo of a caterpillar of the puss moth or you can get it visa versa, things that can be awfully pretty such as this dragonfly and damselfly and beautiful demoiselle.









The last 4 shots are of John, Paul, George and Ringo the Beetles, but before them we will take a look at creatures that mimic each other - a Sandwasp which thinks it's an Ant, a spider that thinks it's a Wasp called (wasp spider). A hummingbird hawk moth, a garden tiger moth and an elephant hawk moth. All these creatures can be spotted along our country lanes, parks and hedge rows, even our own gardens. I have let the photos do the talking. All creatures great and small.




